Knock Character Out of the Park

Purpose:

Students will discuss opportunities to knock character out of the park.

Objectives:

- Review a video of good sportsmanship and discuss why sportsmanship is so important in sports.
- Discuss what each pillar looks and sounds like at a sports-related event.
- Discuss examples of good character by teammates, coaches, and fans.

Anticipatory Set:

- What does it mean to demonstrate good sportsmanship?
- Why is sportsmanship important in sports?

Instructions:

- Watch <u>video</u> about good sportsmanship.
- Discuss how the video knocked the Six Pillars of Character® out of the park.
 - ♦ Trustworthiness: How did the teams, players, and coaches show they were trustworthy?
 - ♦ Respect: How did the teams, players, and coaches show respect?
 - ♦ Responsibility: How did teams, players, and coaches show responsibility?
 - ♦ Fairness: How did the teams, players, and coaches show they were being fair?
 - Caring: How did the teams, players, and coaches show they cared for each other?
 - ♦ Citizenship: How did these teams model good citizenship?

Conclusion:

- Remember this video and the ways the teams modeled the Six Pillars of Character when we go to the ballpark.
- Brainstorm: what is something you can do as a spectator or fan to knock character out of the park?
